

COMMITMENT - CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE PARENT

Recognizing that, Sport has tremendous potential as a contribution to the health, balance and development of the person; The well-being and development of my child is a priority that goes well beyond performance and sporting success.

As a parent of a young athlete, my words and my behavior show that:

- 1. I undertake to ensure that my child respects the Code of conduct of the player that he has read and that I have read.
- 2. I understand that my child has a sport for his pleasure and not for mine.
- 3. I respect coaches and their volunteer work. I also recognize that they are the only ones able to lead the team. So, I avoid advising my child about soccer during games.
- 4. I understand the difficult task of referees and respect their decisions. I demand a similar behavior from my child. I recognize that reacting negatively to a referee will only hurt the situation. I will avoid making derogatory comments and, if necessary, I will notify the coaches.
- 5. I understand the importance of arriving on time for a game or practice.
- 6. I consider victory as one of the pleasures of sport, I downplay defeat and recognize mistakes as part of learning. So, I will always congratulate the effort, whether this effort leads to success or not.
- 7. I accept and respect the limits of each child on the field. I will emphasize the effort rather than the victory or the performance, and this, for all the players, even those of the opposing team. I therefore avoid commenting on or denigrating an opponent, an educator or a teammate of my child.
- 8. I encourage my child to develop his skills and sportsmanship, while recognizing his limits and not projecting excessive ambition on him. I do not see sports kids as miniature sports adults.
- 9. I do not tolerate or encourage physical or psychological violence. I will support all efforts made to eliminate verbal and physical abuse of a sporting event involving children.
- 10. I strive to gain an understanding, appreciation and functional knowledge of the rules to prevent ignorance from biasing my judgment of the decisions of coaches and referees.
- 11. I instill in my child values of respect, discipline, effort and loyalty. I make him responsible for respecting the rules, the rules of the game and the sportsmanship charter, because soccer is above all a game.
- 12. Soccer is a team sport; I will value the team game rather than the individual games.
- 13. I understand that it is forbidden for any parent to go on the soccer field before, during or after the Matches and training.
- 14. I understand that smoking on the field is against the rules. I also recognize that breathing tobacco smoke/drugs is not good for health or pleasant for my young player. I will abide by the rules and refrain from smoking in the field.
- 15. I understand that our team is responsible for picking up any waste left on our side, from the field after our games and practices. I agree to help pick up after each game and practice.
- 16. I accept that my child will play in the category according to his year of birth. I accept that my child is playing for the team in which he / she is placed.
- 17. Prescription glasses are prohibited. The wearing of protective glasses / sportswear is mandatory.
- 18. I respect the fact that there are people in this Club such as Coaches, Directors, Tournament Organizers and Executive Council members, who give their time voluntarily to the children and also, I understand that these people do not get paid.
- 19. I acknowledge if I do not pay my child's registration fee by June 30, 2023, at the latest. This will be considered a debt to the CSRDP Soccer Club. In the event of non-payment, the player will be suspended from the Club, of the Regional Association of Soccer Concordia and the Quebec Soccer Federation.

I undertake to comply with the provisions of the Code of Conduct, failing which, I may be sanctioned according to the regulations in force. I agree and accept the above conditions.
